A retired medical doctor, Bryan S. Thatcher, MD, of Tampa, FL, travels the world speaking on the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, the message of Divine Mercy, Our Lady and the gift of life, and his personal conversion. In 1996 he founded Eucharistic Apostles of the Divine Mercy (EADM), now part of the Order of Congregation of Marians of the Immaculate Conception. EADM is now active in over 45 countries worldwide, and the ministry has received three personally signed Apostolic Blessings from the late Holy Father, Saint Pope John Paul II, for its work.
